Summer Youth Show Gearing Up

Why did little orphan Annie burst into tears during “Annie, Jr.” on the BLT stage in 2009? Because Sandy—her real, LIVE dog—had just darted off stage, and Annie hadn’t rehearsed for *that!*

“Luckily the audience was very forgiving, and Sandy did eventually return,” remembers Autumn Kersey, one of the founders of the Boise Parks & Recreation and BLT Youth Summer Theater Program.

The summer youth program is coming up on its 17th year of providing an artistic outlet to kids in the Treasure Valley, and auditions for “Alice in Wonderland, Jr.” will take place in May.

Typically about 30-40 kids are cast in the all-youth program, though many more audition. The program gives kids from across the valley the opportunity to put on a show together, while learning valuable theater skills from local community theater volunteers.

“I’m very proud of this program for its longevity and the memories it has created for so many kids in the valley,” says Kersey, who grew up in Twin

Falls. “Without summer theater, I would have been a troubled kid. I like to think that the youth program is, in some small way, a safe-haven for kids who are like me.”

The program was founded in 2000, when Kersey was working for Boise Parks & Rec as a seasonal drama teacher. She was surprised Boise didn’t already offer a summer youth program. With approval from BPR Arts Program Director Kay Mack, Kersey called then BLT President Joe Posluszny and asked if she could rent the theater—and what the cost would be. Posluszny called her back 10 minutes later to say she could have the theater all summer for free, and BLT would partner to produce the play and provide a set designer, builder, costumes, props, and a light designer.

“That was the beginning of the now 17-year tradition and not much has changed, except we now perform with recorded music,” says Kersey. “The first three years we used live music with an all – student orchestra and THAT was a challenge!”

Once founded by Kersey, Mack, and Posluszny, the program’s continued success is due to the hard work of many tireless volunteers including: Jim Anderson, John Myers, Clay Lee, Cheryl & Shirley Blauer, Becky Duggan, Sean Magnusson, Brandon Washington, Alies Watson, Jim & Wendy Koepl, Whitney Ulmen, Larry Dennis, Sarah Church Carroll, and many more.

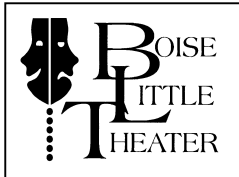
