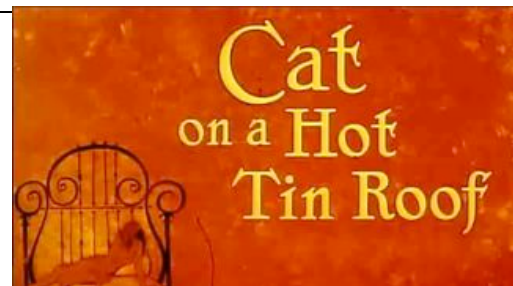
## Bequest from the Spoffords

**Q: How did you first get involved in BLT?**

**Q: What do you think is unique about BLT? Why?**

**A:** Its camaraderie; there are such diverse people, and yet they all blend together during a play. Very seldom is there any animosity.

**Q: What should BLT change or keep doing?**

**A:** Keep having Christmas parties and bring the little kids to them!

**Q: How did you first get involved in BLT?**

**A:** When I was a senior in high school at Meridian High, we put on *The Importance of Being Earnest*. The high school drama teacher asked a director at BLT to give hints and tips to the actors. The BLT director asked four students from the cast of *Earnest* to be in a junior little theater play at Gowen Field, and we performed *Charley's Aunt*. So, I never left. That was the summer of '53.

**Q: What is your favorite memory at BLT?**

**A:** Playing Lachie in *The Hasty Heart*. I spoke in a Scottish accent and wore a kilt [Jody said he was so cute]. I really enjoyed that and won Best Actor [Melody commented that she and Mick knew all the lines]. Another favorite was playing Hysterium in *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum*. Mick was five at the time. In one of the songs I sang, I said, "Stop" and after a pause said "look." I would practice singing at home. On opening night of the show, Mick was in the audience. I sang, "Stop..." and during the pause, Mick said "look" from the audience. Then, I said, "look" and the audience laughed.

**Q: What do you think is unique about BLT? Why?**

**A:** I like the companionship and how people have gotten to be family. And, in community theater, if you need a 50 year old man, you can get a 50 year old man.

**Q: What should BLT change or keep doing?**

**A:** I would like to see newer members come to membership meetings and have a say about what's going on at the theater. Also, it used to be that we would present the membership card and a membership packet (this included a theater handbook that told about all of the committees and workings of the theater, and a copy of the by-laws) to a new member at their first meeting as a member.

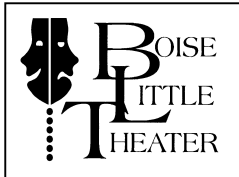
