GREETINGS FROM THE PRESIDENT

Hello All,

It's almost surreal. I was just reading over what I wrote to you last year at this time. I was talking about how we were just about to allow live audiences back into our "Little" theater. March 2021 to March 2022 was a long year. We all had experiences with someone who had gotten sick, gotten sick ourselves, or even worse. That was a long, long year. I'm not saying the most recent year was a walk in the park, but we were doing some theater. We welcomed people back to the theater, made some art, and helped people transport themselves out of their lives, even if for just a moment.

So, I'm asking for a little bit more patience. Even though others in the community have been lifting any kind of masking requirement, the Board has requested that we keep our policy in effect for a little bit longer. I am a big pro-

ponent of the social contract. We had some folks in our cast and crew for These Shining Lives that have certain underlying health conditions that make them more susceptible to getting sick. These people agreed to do the show under certain conditions, including the fact that we were requiring audience members to wear masks, the entire time. Because we are a theater that supports its community, we want to support those people where we can. It's a little thing to wear a mask when inside, but it can mean a big deal to supporting those who are providing us with their time and talents, so the thea-



ter can receive financial support from the community. I just ask you to remember when we couldn't even do theater.

These Shining Lives by Melanie Marnich, directed by Sarah Wright opens March 11 and runs for three weeks. This is the true-life story of the women who lost their lives to Radium poisoning but made tremendous strides in women's and worker's rights. This wonderfully staged production will make you feel, hurt, cry, and laugh out loud. I can't wait.

MEET THE NOMINEES FOR THE BLT BOARD

After a brief stint of taking time away to have kids I'm ready to be back as an active part of the community. I have a Masters degree in Entrepreneurship and Small Business Studies and feel I can be a valuable asset within the Board, able to give both a business and artistic point of view.



Elizabeth Greeley: I have been a working member of Boise Little Theater for almost 40 years, and manager of the wardrobe almost as long.
