Ann was involved in 27 shows at BLT, mostly appearing as an actress. She received three acting awards: Best Supporting Actress for playing Domina in *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way*



to the Forum (1982), Best Cameo for playing Miss Flora Van Huysen in *The Matchmaker* (1983), and Best Cameo for *Cabaret* (1987). Ann is pictured above (second from the left) in *But Why Bump Off Barnaby?* (1997), the last show she performed in before moving to Washington.

Joanna Marshall writes, "When we moved to Boise in 1954, the folks bought a house that was owned by John & Ruth Scott. John was the president of Boise Little Theater. Our next door neighbors were John & Minijean Kirk, and that John was later president of BLT. Across the street neighbors were Mike & Martha Savage (also very active in BLT). So, naturally, Mom was destined to be involved with the Theater. Dad would have been immune to all of these theater influences were it not for Mom!

"She came home from rehearsals and told him they needed help building a set (and eventually a theater) and Papa grabbed his tools and went to the theater. Mom said Helen and Maynard Smith needed help with house crew so Dad put on a suit and went down to the theater. (She even made a small evening dress for me so I could help too.) Mom said the theater needed shelves in the library to put scripts on, so he bought lumber and built shelves.

"I think you might have noticed a pattern here: not that Papa didn't enjoy watching shows at BLT, he just didn't want to spend a lot of his time there. He would rather be fishing!"

An Ann Clarkson recipe from the BLT Hearty Party Cookbook

Ice Cream (ala Clarkson) (Yields 6 servings)

3/4 c. Jamaica rum
6 T. apricot preserves
1 qt. vanilla ice cream
(optional, sliced bananas
or other fresh fruit)

Blend rum with preserves in a chafing dish or 2 quart glass saucepan. Scoop ice cream onto dessert plates and ring with fruit (if used).

Heat sauce until warm. Bring to table. Touch a match to sauce and stir vigorously while it burns. When flames dies, pour over ice cream.
