We're saddened to report Vicki Patterson's passing on April 19, 2013.

Along with an impressive list of community and legislative involvement, Vicki was a prominent figure at Boise Little Theater for many years. Her obituary gives us insights into her association with BLT:

"Vicki's first experience at the Boise Little Theatre was in "The Women" at the age of 10, the only child in a large cast of women. She developed her love for being on stage. In her words, "I love walking on that stage and seeing that curtain open." She loved being on the stage and relating a story to the audience and worked with many talented actors and directors. Among her many performances for the Little Theatre were "A Majority of One", "The Play's the Thing", "Visit to a Small Planet", "The Philadelphia Story", "Steel Magnolias", "The Gazebo", "Dylan", "In the Rest Room at Rosenbloom's". She and Don Hawkins also performed "Love Letters" throughout the community. She received the Gold Key Award in the 1999/2000 season and received the high honor of the Beulah Award in the 1970/71 season for Best Supporting Actress for her role as Caitlin in Dylan."

In lieu of flowers, Vicki's family has suggested that people make memorial donations to several organizations, including Boise Little Theater.

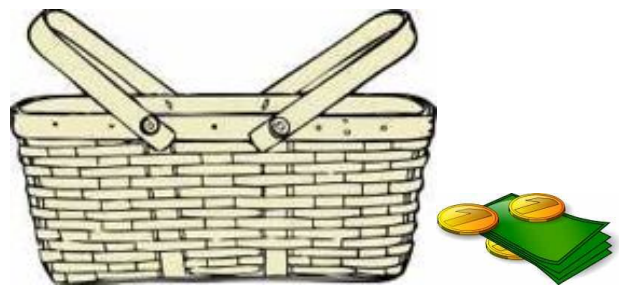
## **Important Reminder about BLT Membership and Save the Date for the Picnic!**

Q: If heaven exists, what would you like to hear God say when you arrive at the pearly gates?

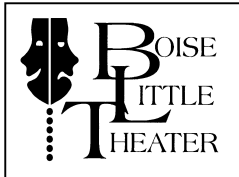
