Remembering John Elliott

John Elliott, a beloved member of Boise's theater community, passed away May 23, 2016, at the age of 66. A graduate of Boise State University's theater program, John was involved in dozens of productions on just about every stage in town, including Subal Theatre (BSU), Boise Little Theater, Idaho Shakespeare Festival, Stage Coach Theatre, Boise Music Week, Spontaneous Productions, and Alley Repertory Theatre. He toured in one-man shows about Teddy Roosevelt and Tennessee Williams, appeared in commercials and film, and helped produce benefit shows for Hulls Gulch and the ACLU. He was an inductee of BSU's Alumni Hall of Fame, an Idaho Statesman Distinguished Citizen, and a recipient of the Mayor's Award for the Arts.

John especially loved Boise Little Theater, where he directed, designed, and performed in over 30 productions over the span of three decades and served as board member and president. Having an uncanny eye for detail, John designed gorgeous sets, and his love for art and beauty carried over into his work and personal life. He owned and operated Elliott's Collectibles and Elliott's Downtown, and for the last several years he worked with his dear friends at Rose Hill Coins and Jewelry. He enjoyed scuba diving, gardening, and visiting with family.

Friends and loved ones gathered at Boise Little Theater in June to celebrate John's life. Emcee Carole Whiteleather and speakers Dr. Charles Lauterbach and Joe Jacoby shared a wealth of joyful and poignant memories of John, including hilarious accounts of his playful and mischievous nature. The program concluded with the whole audience singing "Life is a Cabaret" in his honor.

Boise Little Theater is grateful to John's family for choosing BLT as the venue for the celebration and for generously designating BLT as the recipient of memorial donations. We will

never forget John Elliott and the tremendous creative legacy he left our community.

Lighting & Box Office Upgrades

New upgrades to the lighting and box office will result in expanded lighting options and a friendlier, more efficient ticket buying process for BLT patrons.

After *Flaming Idiots* closed last season, the Backstage Pirates (a local group of professional theatre technicians) spent a week at BLT installing 20 new LED lights in the auditorium, including new Source Fours above the booth, and new Cyc LEDs over the stage. They also set up a rep plot that will not only save us money in electrical costs, but will also cut down the light programming time from days to hours and allow exponentially greater lighting design capabilities.

In the box office, a new all-in-one desktop computer was purchased, as well as a subscription to Microsoft 365, which will ensure BLT stays up-to-date on the newest versions of Word, Excel, etc. A new version of Quicken – the software used for all accounting purposes – was also purchased, and the computer desk was moved to a different wall.

"Now the box office employees will not have their back to patrons while making tickets," explained Sarah Church Carroll. "It should be more customer friendly."

In addition, an iPad was purchased and installed on the wall between the two ticketing windows. Once it's wirelessly connected to the Boca ticket printer, employees can easily input the ticket details using the iPad and then send them directly to the printer.

BLT Student Club Update

The Student Club wrapped up its first summer by saying goodbye to two seniors: Cameron Uli and Nick Cravens both left at the end of the summer to attend college. Uli will attend Cornish College of the Arts in Seattle, and Cravens will attend the University of Idaho in Moscow.

Over the summer, club members enjoyed several educational clinics including Renaissance sword fighting and old age makeup.

New members are welcome and may join the club at anytime throughout the year. Requirements are:

- ages 12 20
- maintain good grades
- volunteer at BLT for a minimum of 10 hours/year

A variety of benefits are offered to club members. Students may sign up for monthly clinics to learn new skills such as set design, construction, and painting; lighting and sound; stage combat and sword fighting; improv; makeup and costuming; and more. Also, qualifying students will have the opportunity to apply for scholarships offered by BLT.
