

Autumn Haynes.....Director: Autumn recently earned her Bachelor of Arts in Communication from Boise State University with a minor in Theatre and she dreams of directing an all youth repertory theatre company one day. Autumn's passion for theatre began at a very early age and she never seemed to grow out of it, performing in summer musicals with Twin Falls' Junior Musical Playhouse (JUMP Co.) and taking on such roles as Elizabeth Proctor in "The Crucible," Bellomy in "The Fantastiks," Laura in "The Glass Menagerie," and the Fairy Godmother in Boise State University's production of "Cinderella." Autumn credits her mentor's Robin Havens, Howard Miller and Dr. Fran Tanner for her interest in directing, specifically directing youth. Autumn dedicates her hard work on this production to her favorite cowboy, her Grandpa!

Rebecca Turner....Music Director: Rebecca holds a Bachelor of Music Degree in Music Education from Boise State University where she graduated as a Top Ten Scholar and Magna Cum Laude. Rebecca has performed various opera theatre excerpts such as "The Merry Widow," Constanze from "The Abduction from Seraglio," and the role of Susanna in BSU's production of "Le Nozze di Figaro." Rebecca has also portrayed Hodel in Music Theatre of Idaho's production of "Fiddler on the Roof" and performed as the soprano soloist in the Magic Valley Chorale's production of "Elijah" and as a guest soloist with the Meridian Symphony. Currently, Rebecca performs with the Opera Idaho Resident Company and teaches private voice lessons. Starting this fall Rebecca will teach k-6 music at McKinley and Highlands Elementary schools.

Clay Lee....Director of Choreography: Clay has been involved in dance since age three, following in his mother's footsteps Clay is now teaching dance at five Treasure Valley dance studios. Clay has been involved in several musicals as both choreographer and dancer including the 1999 Boise Music Week's production of "42nd Street" and Boise Little Theater's youth production of "Bye Bye Birdie" in 2000.
